To establish clear and consistent biological definitions of male and female.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Defining Male and Fe-

5 male Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF "SEX", "MALE", "FEMALE", AND RE-

7 LATED TERMS.

8 Chapter 1 of title 1, United States Code, is amended9 by adding at the end the following:

1 "SEC. 9. DEFINITION OF 'SEX', 'MALE', 'FEMALE', AND RE-2LATED TERMS.

3 "In determining the meaning of any Act of Congress,
4 or of any ruling, regulation, or interpretation of the var5 ious departments and Federal agencies of the United
6 States, the term—

7 "(1) 'boy' means a minor human male;

8 "(2) 'father' means a male parent;

9 "(3) 'female', when used to refer to a natural 10 person, means a person belonging, at conception, to 11 the sex characterized by a reproductive system with 12 the biological function of producing eggs (ova);

"(4) 'gender identity' means an identity that re-13 14 flects an internal and subjective sense of self, disconnected from biological reality and sex and existing 15 16 on an indeterminate continuum, and, because such 17 an identity does not provide a meaningful basis for 18 identification for purposes of Federal law, the term 19 shall not be recognized by the Federal Government 20 as a replacement for sex;

21 "(5) 'girl' means a minor human female;
22 "(6) 'male', when used to refer to a natural
23 person, means a person belonging, at conception, to
24 the biological sex characterized by a reproductive
25 system with the biological function of producing
26 sperm;

"(7) 'man', except when used as a generic ref-1 2 erence to human beings, means an adult human 3 male; "(8) 'mother' means a female parent; 4 "(9) 'sex', when referring to a natural person's 5 6 individual's sex, means the person's immutable biological classification as either male or female, as bio-7 8 logically determined and defined by this section; and

"(10) 'woman' means an adult human female.".
